CRSAR

The Campbell River Search and Rescue Society (CRSAR) is a registered, nonprofit charitable society organized and operated by volunteer members. CRSAR is responsible for Search and Rescue (SAR) activities from Oyster River, north to Bella Coola, west to Nootka Island and east to the mainland coast of BC. We can also be tasked to respond anywhere in BC. The group consists of 40+ members specializing in Ground Search and Rescue, while simultaneously maintaining specialty teams in the areas of Swift Water Rescue, Rope Rescue, Alpine Rescue, Avalanche Rescue, and others. The number of calls responded to vary from year to year, and typically fall in the 30 to 45 range. Call-outs (also known as tasks) can last from hours to consecutive days.

In addition to the time CRSAR members spend on searches, many hours are spent on training, planning, administration, fundraising and public education. The tasks are overseen by the RCMP, but can also be initiated by the Coroners Service, Parks Canada, British Columbia Ambulance Service, Fire Departments, Local Government during civil emergencies and other SAR agencies for mutual support. In the course of their activities, CRSAR members are unpaid professionals, and are held to a high standard of practice, with a particular regard for safety. While task expenses are covered by Emergency Management B.C. (EMBC), and training costs are covered by CRSAR or the Justice Institute, members bear the cost of travel to training and events, as well as a basic equipment kit.

GSAR

Ground Search and Rescue (GSAR) training is the initial standard for all search & rescue members in BC. This 96 hour course is administered by volunteer instructors at the local group level. Topics covered include SAR in BC, Maps & Compass, Survival, Communications, Rope Management, Tracking, Helicopter Safety, Avalanche Orientation, and Search Techniques. CRSAR typically offers the GSAR course annually and runs it in an intensive approach. Training is Thursday evenings 7:00 to 9:30, and Sunday 9:00 to 5:00 for approximately 10 weeks consecutively. Additionally one overnight survival campout is scheduled in that time. Six exams are part of the course and are made up of both written and practical content.

Requirements

Members come from many walks of life but must meet the following requirements:

- 19 years of age at time of training
- Support from spouse and family
- Ability to deal with stressful and emotional situations
- Physically capable (i.e. hiking in uneven heavy bush, lifting a stretcher, etc.)

Before GSAR Training:

- Submit a Completed Application Package Including: Membership Application Form, Criminal Record Disclosure (clear of any entries), Drivers Abstract o Medical Information Form
- Confidentiality/Authorization Form
- Attend a GSAR information session
- Attend a personal interview for selection purposes

During GSAR Training:

- Attend all scheduled GSAR training sessions as a member in training
- Maintain a minimum of 75% on all written & practical exams
- Show an aptitude for teamwork and initiative
- Come prepared with suitable clothing and equipment as laid out by the instructors
- Complete a basic 20-hour wilderness first aid course

After Successful GSAR Training:

- Posses all required equipment of a 24-hour survival pack as laid out in the GSAR training manual
- Apply & be accepted as a probationary member of CRSAR
- Document a minimum of 100 hours per calendar year, distributed among the categories of call-outs, training, meetings and public /fundraising events.
- After a minimum of six-month a probationary member may apply to become a regular member
- Show a commitment to professional development as it relates to search & rescue
- Abide by and operate according to all CRSAR constitutions, bylaws, policies & guidelines
